Best Finance PhD Paper Presented at the GSF Workshops in 2022

Aleksi Pitkäjärvi (Aalto University) received the award for Best Finance PhD Paper Presented at the GSF Workshops in 2022 for his paper "Slow Belief Updating and the Disposition Effect". The award was presented for the first time in 2022. The chairman of the GSF Board, Professor Anders Löflund and the GSF Director Mikko Leppämäki presented the award at the GSF Winter Workshop in Finance.



Collaboration with the New Research Project Funded by OP Group Research Foundation

The OP Group Research Foundation has granted 1,2 million euros for a joint research project by Aalto University, University of Jyväskylä and University of Vaasa. The GSF will collaborate with the research group by organizing doctoral courses on financial institutions and intermediation. So far an intensive doctoral course on Financial Intermediation Theory has been confirmed for August 2023, taught by Professor Itay Goldstein (Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania). In addition, during spring 2023 there will a couple of dedicated seminar talks on financial institution at the Helsinki Finance Seminars. The launching event of this new collaboration will be the Aalto Financial Institutions Mini-Conference with five leading scholars from US presenting their research on hedge funds and financial markets.

News from the Nordic Finance Network (NFN)

After the COVID-19 pandemic, all the NFN core activities have returned to in-person mode. Last year we witnessed a very strong demand for in-person PhD courses and workshops. For 2023, we have already received information on 13 upcoming courses. One particular highlight of this year's NFN course offering will be a PhD course on "Sustainable Finance" organized by the GSF in August.
