Doctoral Dissertations by GSF Students in 2024

In 2024, four doctoral students from the GSF member universities finished their doctoral degrees in Finance: Matteo Vacca (Aalto) "Three Essays in Behavioral and Corporate Finance", Habeeb Yahya (Turku) "ESG and Financial Performance of Firms: Nordic Evidence", Sinh Thoi Mai (Hanken) "Essays on Monetary Policy Shocks and Firm Strategic Response: Applications of Machine Learning Methods" and Alexander Back (Hanken) "Essays on Volatility Modeling".

All of them have chosen to continue their careers in academia. Dr. Matteo Vacca (Aalto) joined Hanken as a tenure track Assistant Professor in Finance. Dr. Habeeb Yahya continues as a postdoctoral researcher at the University of Turku and Dr. Alexander Back as a lecturer at Hanken. Dr. Sinh Thoi Mai (Hanken) in turn has started as an Assistant Professor at ISEG - Lisbon School of Economics & Management, University of Lisbon. Congratulations to all!



News from the Nordic Finance Network (NFN)

In November 2024 the NFN organized the 13th annual Young Scholars Nordic Finance Workshop in Helsinki in collaboration with Hanken School of Economics. The workshop featured presentations by assistant professors and job market candidates from six Nordic universities.

The next NFN workshop, the PhD Nordic Finance Workshop, will take place in May at Copenhagen Business School.

Year 2024 was a record year in terms of NFN travel grants. The NFN awarded travel grants to 40 Finance PhD students from Nordic universities to cover their travel costs when attending a doctoral course in another Nordic country. The NFN's aim is to promote mobility and networking among Nordic doctoral students, and the number of travel grants indicates a clear need for such support.

The GSF has many interesting activities coming up in the spring and summer. We will report on those in our next GSF newsletter for alumni that will be sent out in the beginning of the fall semester.
